Program Spotlight

The team at Phoenix House Florida consists of master's level and/or licensed, highly qualified clinicians who complete ASAM (American Society of Addiction Medicine) accredited assessments in order to determine the appropriate services, if any, that are needed for each individual.

ASAM (American Society of Addiction Medicine) assessments are multidimensional and based on the degree of services needed to achieve success. Examples of dimensions assessed include aspects of the individual that impact substance use.

When you arrive for your assessment, you will complete documentation, sign consents, and provide your insurance and identification card. Please bring a list of all medications. At the conclusion, you will be provided with a medically appropriate recommendation.
